Key Bank update

On October 6, 2023, CIAO's treasurer went to the local Key Bank to make a deposit. Our treasurer counted and recounted the deposit before going to the bank. At the bank, the teller counted the deposit, came up with the same total, and issued a receipt. Ten days later, CIAO received a notice from Key Bank stating that they had debited our account \$740 because three checks had been scanned twice. CIAO officers met with the local Key Bank manager to dispute the charge. Despite presenting the bank receipt, the manager essentially brushed us off. We pursued the matter up the corporate ladder, and appealed to bank executives in Cleveland, Ohio. CIAO's co-chairs and treasurer have been contacting and talking to many of the executive officers' secretaries, and each one would shift the issue to other personnel. We received the runaround each time. It was very aggravating staying on the phone, on hold, for up to 30 minutes. Promises were made, stating they would return the call within 24/48 hours, all with no follow up call. As of Monday, January 29, after being on the phone for 3 hours - still no results - someone will contact CIAO - niente! We are not giving up - it was wrong on the part of the bank and they will not admit it. This is very unprofessional of the Key Bank executive offices.

Valentine's Day Celebration in Italy

In Italy, Land of Love and Lovers, Valentine's Day is a holiday imported from the US, just like Halloween and Mother's Day. The day is dedicated to the celebration of love and is called *il giorno della festa degli innamorati*. Typically, as lovers exclusively celebrate this day, family members and friends do not exchange gifts. Couples usually go out for dinner at a *pizzeria* or *ristorante*. Since the main color on Valentine's Day is red, many restaurants decorate tables with red candles, red dishes and red flowers as a sign of love and passion. Traditional presents are roses, perfume, chocolates and diamonds, depending on age and taste. A very popular Valentine's Day gift in Italy is a box of *Baci Perugina*, small chocolate covered hazelnuts containing a romantic quote in four languages.

The Festivities of Carnival Time

Easter falls on Sunday March 31, 2024, as the culmination of the period of Lent and Holy Week. From Ash Wednesday (February 14 in 2024) until Easter Saturday, Christians traditionally enter the 40 day period of fasting known as Lent which is meant to reflect Christ's 40 days in the wilderness and is held straight after the festivities of Carnival.

Many, many yeas ago most of the people of Italy's cities, towns and villages spent weeks celebrating Carnival time. Today it remains a very colorful festival, especially in Venice and other major cities, but it is for shorter periods of time than in the past. For seven days and nights prior to Lent the air is alive with music and laughter. The word carnival is derived from two Latin words - *carni* (meat) and *vale* (good bye) which is easily translated into "good-bye to meat." In Venice the Carnival tradition began in 1420 to celebrate the victory of the Venetian troops over Aquileia. Carnival peaked in the 1700s and its magical elegance was documented by the painters in their masterpieces.
